“PTSD and Its Effect on the Family”– A history of the speaker’s experience as a spouse of a Wounded Warrior: What to notice about a change in a loved one’s personality; How to adjust to what dynamics are going on in the relationship; The effect on the children of a returning Combat Veteran; and Being able to focus on getting needed help to improve on readjustment issues.

“Pharmacology and PTSD” – Dr. Berger will be addressing ideology, symptomatology, and treatment issues in Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.

“Military Sexual Trauma” – This presentation will define MST, discuss the prevalence of MST as well as its impact on veterans. We will briefly discuss recovery and intervention strategies and resources for treatment. Discussion of VA Mandates for identification and provision of services will be included.

“Veterans and Family Issues” – Speaker will discuss adjustment issues related to US Troops and their families returning home from Iraq.

“Suicide and the SAFE Program – Family Impact” – Participants will learn the signs of suicidality, as well as what to do if someone is in crisis. Operation S.A.V.E. means know the Signs of depression and suicidality; Ask the appropriate questions; Validate the person’s experience and feelings; and Expedite a referral for appropriate treatment.

Resource Tables - Talk to service providers to obtain help in learning more about overcoming trauma issues and accessing community services.

About the Keynote Speaker

Retired 1st LT. Harry McFarland is both a Vietnam and Iraq War Veteran. He served in the pull out of Saigon while with the Marines in May 1975. He also completed two tours in Iraq while serving in the PA National Guard. He was retired as a 1st Lieutenant.

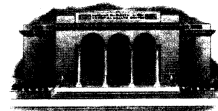
